Attached, for your consideration, is a resolution transferring \$22,000 from the City 's Contingency to the Legal Department to cover expected additional bills for legal services for this year. The original budget for the City Attorney was \$200,000 for FY 05. Through February, however, the City had expended \$146,336. If we continue incurring costs at this rate, our Legal Budget will be over-expended by almost \$20,000 for the year. To avoid this situation, I am proposing that the Council transfer \$22,000 from the City's Contingency to the Legal Department budget. The additional \$2,000 over the estimated shortfall is requested simply to provide a small cushion in the event that actual expenses exceed our estimate.

## **RESOLUTION NO. 1243**
