

RESOLUTION NO. 1659

A RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
SALISBURY, MARYLAND AUTHORIZING A TIME EXTENSION  
FOR TEMPORARY TRAVEL-LANE SHIFTS AND CLOSURES ON  
PARSONS ROAD AND PEMBERTON DRIVE FOR PUBLIC  
SAFETY AND CONVENIENCE.

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted rules for temporary road closures of the City's streets and highways to ensure public safety and convenience with Resolution 1023; and,

WHEREAS, the owners of Rite Aid are installing storm water, water, and sewer mains and widening the road in the public rights of way of Parsons Road and Pemberton Drive which will require temporary vehicular travel lane shifts and closures of approximately 60 days in duration; and,

WHEREAS, the period for vehicular travel lane shifts and closures of Parsons Road and Pemberton Drive will be extended an additional 31 calendar days (from May 24, 2008 thru June 23, 2008), beyond the original Council-approved 60-day road-closure period (from March 24, 2008 thru May 23, 2008) established in Resolution 1586, dated October 22, 2007, to compensate for curtailed construction activities in the public rights of way of Parsons Road and Pemberton Drive due to rainy weather, wet construction-site conditions, and unforeseen existing utility conditions encountered during the months of April and May 2008; and,

WHEREAS, Parsons Road (between Nanticoke Road and Pemberton Drive) is to be closed to thru traffic for approximately 5 working days to facilitate storm drain construction in the Parsons Road/Pemberton Drive intersection; and,

WHEREAS, Nanticoke Road and part of Parsons Road which are state roads, will require temporary travel-lane shifts and closures subject to state approval; and

WHEREAS, the City Council rules established in accordance with Resolution 1023 require a City Council resolution authorizing temporary road closures in excess of 30 days;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Salisbury City Council approves the temporary vehicular travel lane shifts and closures of Pemberton Drive and Parsons Road for a period not to exceed ninety-one calendar days in accordance with a traffic control plan submitted by BL Companies representing Rite Aid and approved by the Department of Public Works in accordance with the standards of the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD).
